SNIP Alliance is proud to update our supporters on our progress. Over 600 cats/dogs have undergone spay/neuter surgery in 2019, bringing our total to date to 7,875. We are doing our part to reduce the number of unwanted litters of puppies and kittens in Madison County.

Below, on Animal Care and Control graph, you will see the effects of our spay/neuter program on reducing pet overpopulation and euthanasia. SNIP Alliance's work is not only incredibly humane, it is also fiscally responsible. The cost to sterilize an animal is less than housing it in a shelter.

We are grateful to have mobile veterinary services to help us accomplish our mission. Our average cost per animal is \$77.50. Our two-day clinics serve about 60 animals so each clinic runs about \$2,500.00 per day. With your support, we know we can increase the number of clinics offered in 2020.



Well, it's been a fast 6 months since I was hired in June. I'm grateful to everyone who has helped me along the way so far! I believe in the work we do because I am passionate about life and caring for those who cannot care for themselves. Spay/Neuter is the only proactive way to control how many puppies and kittens are born unwanted.

We would like to expand on what we've been doing for the last 10 years by taking our mobile clinics to more towns in Madison County to ensure our services are accessible to as many people as possible. About 67% of our annual \$100,00.00 budget is dedicated to s/n clinics and we are seeking grant funding for those. But, we still your need help meeting our daily operating budget in order to keep this work going.

We have a new partnership with the Veterans' Assistance Commission of Madison County and we're looking forward to helping vets get their pets fixed and healthy in 2020.

We're implementing a practicum opportunity in 2020 for vet students to work with and observe the vet during a clinic. This is imperative since there is a shortage of vets across the country.

We would like to thank you for your support. Your care for animals and their welfare is the heart and soul of SNIP Alliance and the River-Bend Pet Food Pantry. Together, we will continue to make a difference in our community!
